



Community Service Project

By the time you read this, our community service project for 2009 should be substantially completed. As you may remember, the Boston Chapter has been helping make some sorely needed plumbing improvements at Annawon Council's BSA Camp Norse in Kingston,

It came to our attention that Camp Norse was in need of some substantial plumbing upgrades. With an eye on water and energy conservation, the Boston Chapter purchased and donated eight sensor operated faucets to replace old dripping manual faucets, two new energy-efficient gas fired water heaters, ten new showerheads, and most impressive of all: six drinking water bubblers fed by over 3,000 feet of new water piping. Many of the program areas in remote locations of the camp didn't have running water...until now.

Thanks to the vision and efforts of the Boston Chapter Board of Directors, our Affiliate members, and members of the Local 12 Plumbers Union, we were able to purchase the various fixtures, heaters and piping, and the plumbers of Local 12 volunteered their time to help with the installation. They did an awesome job. I will have a full report in the next monthly newsletter, and I will take the time to properly thank the specific individuals and companies involved in this undertaking. It has been a rewarding project which we would like to continue again next year. If you have any suggestions for future community service projects, I'd love to hear them.

Water Conservation Tips

And speaking of water conservation, did you know the following:

- A leaky toilet can waste 60 gallons of water per day, 22,000 gallons per year. To test your toilet for leaks, put a dye tablet or a few drops of food coloring in the toilet tank. If color appears in the bowl within an hour, your toilet is slowly leaking.
- Some faucets drip noisily and others ooze silently at the base; some leaks are not even big enough to register on your meter. But any leak, no matter how small, is a big waste of water over time.
- A slow steady drip can waste 75 gallons per week, a fast drip up to 200 gallons per week. A steady stream will waste as much as 1,000 gallons per week.
- A garden hose without a nozzle can waste up to 10 gallons per minute.
- A washing machine can use up to 50 gallons of water per load; make sure you only wash full loads.
- Swimming pools should be filled early in the season rather than at the end of May. This helps reduce the demand on the water treatment facility and the water distribution system.


